You'll find out how to adjust your driving to age-related changes in vision, hearing and reaction time – all without taking a test. **And, the cost is still only \$10.**

In Connecticut, those who complete the first-time 8-hour certification classroom course may be eligible for at least a 5% reduction in automobile liability insurance premiums for two (2) years.

**Reason #3 The course is available online.**

**Reason #4 Weeknight & Weekend Courses to accommodate busy schedules.**

AARP isn't the American Association of Retired Persons anymore. Why? Because over half of the 38 million members, including 600,000 in CT, are still working! So, if driver refresher classes offered mid-week during the day won't work into your work schedule, come on nights or weekends! We've got full 8-hour classes you can complete in just one Saturday. You'll find classes offered in two (2) four- hour sessions.

**Reason #5 The Driver Safety Program is driven by volunteers!**

Courses and more volunteers have been added to bring classes closer making it easier for people to attend. Volunteers help drive to new locales. More volunteers are needed! If you'd like to become part of a highly-motivated "driven" certified driver safety volunteer corps, AARP would like to have you join.

**Reason #6 There are classes for the hearing impaired and in Spanish.**

AARP is in the process of expanding the Driver Safety Program into communities throughout Connecticut – in places where they weren't available before.
